Non-Teaching Staff School Introduction Training Days

The Department of Education is seeking people who are interested in commencing work within public schools in your area.

The School Administrative and Support (SAS) Staff Reference Group welcome any people looking to start work in school administration to enrol in our Non-Teaching Staff School Introduction training programs.

The aim of this training is to provide participants with an overview of school administrative roles. Participation in these introduction days are **not** a guarantee of employment with the Department of Education. Participants are required to obtain a Working with Children Check (WWCC) clearance for paid work at their own cost. <https://www.kidsguardian.nsw.gov.au/child-safe-organisations/working-with-children-check>. Payment is then made through Service NSW prior to attending day one. To enable processing for potential employment participants are required to bring necessary completed forms, which appear on the MyPL registration page. Many schools have a policy of not employing current parents or associates within their own school.

It would be desirable if participants had a sound knowledge of the Microsoft Office suite.

The training days will be held in the following locations:

Port Macquarie Library – Thursday 25 October & Wednesday 7 November 2018
Forster office – Monday 22 October 2018 & Tuesday 6 November 2018

To secure a place in this course, participants will need to register online as a community member on MyPL. Go to the following site <https://mypl.education.nsw.gov.au/> and select Register. After completing the details, an email will be sent with instructions on how to get started and select the venue you wish to attend. The course codes are Day 1: NR22842, Day 2: NR22844.

There will be no cost to the participant other than them acquiring their WWCC prior to attending the training. Tea and coffee will be available throughout the day. Participants are to provide their own morning tea and lunch.

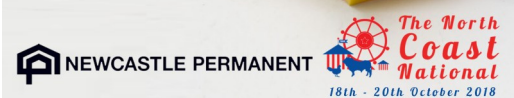

Entry Fee: **TURSA Art Prize** \$10.00 (includes GST)
North Coast National Youth Art Awards Free

1. All work must be original and executed by the exhibitor unaided, within the past two years and have won a prize in any exhibition previously. No copies or artworks done with assistance in workshops or classes etc will be acceptable in any section. Works must not have been shown previously at the TURSA Art Prize.

No more than four (4) entries per person/per section and only one accepted at maximum size per section (see clause 5).

Only traditional art mediums are accepted, ie. Paint, pastel, pencil, linocut etc. **No photograph digital art accepted.**

2. All artwork entered must be for sale. A commission of 20% from the indicated price of the work be deducted by the Society. Payment within 30 days. On the opening night the society will be waiving its commission to encourage the sale of artists work.

3. **Delivery time for works - Monday 15 October from 9am to 2pm.** Artworks to be delivered to the Gem Club Pavilion, Lismore Showgrounds (unless special arrangements have been made for early delivery). Artwork may be forwarded by post and will be returned at the artist's expense. Even will be taken of exhibits by the Society, but no responsibility will be accepted for loss or damage desired, exhibitors can arrange their own insurance at their own expense.

4. Artworks must be ready for safe display with 2 x D rings (min. size 1cm) 5-7cms from the top of artwork. As artworks are hung from the D rings, any hanging wire must be loose enough to allow access to the D rings. **No screw eyes accepted.**

5. All works must be dry and not exceed 150 cms in either direction including the frame OR exceed 150cm.

6. Artworks without suitable safe hanging apparatus, unsuitably framed or oversized will not be exhibited.

7. The back of each artwork **MUST** show the following: Section, Title of Artwork, Price, Name of A Address and Phone Number.

8. All artworks are to be displayed for the duration of the exhibition. If too many entries are received selection for hanging in the Gem Club Pavilion will be decided by the Committee. Excess entries

be displayed elsewhere if space permits. All artworks that meet the Conditions of Entry will be judged and every effort made to exhibit all entries.

The Committee reserves the right to withhold any entry which it considers unsuitable in any manner or does not meet the Conditions of Entry. Entry fees are non-refundable.

The Committee reserves the right to cancel any section if there are less than five (5) entries. The individual artwork will be allocated to the next appropriate section.

9. **Artworks will be released** between 9am and 11am Commencing Monday 22nd of October - Friday 26th of October. All artworks not collected by 5pm on Monday 29th of October 2018 remain at the owner's own risk. **PROOF OF IDENTIFICATION WILL BE REQUIRED TO COLLECT WORKS.**

10. **Prize Money:** All prize money/vouchers to be collected from the Secretary's Office if not presented to the artist at the Awards Evening. No prize money will be paid after 1 November, 2018.

11. The Committee reserves the right to have any work reproduced (without fee) in the press and on television, the Society's website and social media. The artist is responsible for ensuring that no relevant copyright laws are infringed. The signed entry form is evidence of the artist's consent.

12. The decision of the judge shall be final and if a dispute arises not covered by the Conditions of Entry, the decision of the Committee will also be final.

13. **Youth Art Awards:** The entry must be the **child's own original and unaided work** and have been completed in the previous two years. Entries must be framed with D-rings (1cm min) or mounted on thin cardboard.

Only traditional art mediums are accepted, ie. Paint, pastel, pencil, linocut etc. **No photography or digital art accepted.**
