We encourage the children to pack their lunch using products that can be reused or recycled or composted.


We have compost bins at school to take care of food scraps and paper lunch wraps.

We'd like to make every Wednesday a no waste and healthy lunch day. Of course it would be great to have no waste every day. Healthy food is important for healthy bodies and it allows students to succeed at learning and it is good for the environment (no packaging).

You can pack a healthy no waste lunch by putting fruit and vegetable snacks in plastic or metal re-useable containers and wrapping sandwiches in paper not plastic.

We'll be doing lunch audits on Wednesday and the class with the greatest percentage of no waste lunches will be rewarded with a healthy treat.

Let's aim to have **every** Wednesday a **No Waste Lunch** day.

Hot foods at school

An increasing number of children have been bringing noodles to school and asking staff to heat them up for lunch.

At this week's staff meeting a number of issues of concern were raised.

The primary issue is a safety one as the noodles require heating with boiling water. Of course students are not allowed to use boiling water at school which leaves the staff juggling bowls under the hydroboil with the potential for a burns accident.

Another factor is time. If one child wants lunch heated that takes just 5 minutes but if 10 children want lunch heated that takes the whole lunch break. Teachers often have to do playground duty and therefore have only 20 minutes to eat their own lunch and prepare for their next lessons.

We'd also like to become a waste free school with children bringing nude foods to school.

We are aware that packing lunches can be hard for parents negotiating with children about what they will eat at school. There are lots of websites and books with ideas for happy healthy lunch boxes.




