Come and join in the excitement of our Christmas clinic! The program is aimed at juniors from 5 – 16 years old who are beginner's right through to regular players.



#### 12 easy ways to beat school holiday boredom at home

#### 1. Hold a cupcake/cookie decorating competition

A cupcake or cookie decorating competition is the perfect way to keep the kids amused for a few hours AND sort afternoon tea.

#### 2. Enjoy a movie marathon

A rainy day is the perfect time to organise a movie marathon. Perhaps choose a movie series such as *Spy Kids* or movies with a theme, such as space, nature or comedy.

#### 3. Organise a bug hunt in the backyard
