21 March is Harmony Day

Everyone is welcome to wear orange to school tomorrow (if you own orange clothing)

Harmony Day is a day to celebrate Australian multiculturalism, based on the successful integration of migrants into our community.

Australia is the most successful multicultural country on earth and we should celebrate this and work to maintain it.

Harmony Day is about inclusiveness, respect and belonging for all Australians, regardless of cultural or linguistic background, united by a set of core Australian values.

Held every year on 21 March. The Day coincides with the <u>United</u> <u>Nations International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimi-</u> <u>nation</u>.

Since 1999, more than 70,000 Harmony Day events have been held in childcare centres, schools, community groups, churches, businesses and federal, state and local government agencies across Australia.

Why orange?

Orange is the colour chosen to represent Harmony Day. Traditionally, orange signifies social communication and meaningful conversations. It also relates to the freedom of ideas and encouragement of mutual respect. Australians can choose to wear something orange on 21 March to show their support for cultural diversity and an inclusive Australia.

Lice Alert



We have reports of lice and nits in the school.

We would like ALL families to recheck their children's hair this weekend 2/3rd March and treat if necessary.

Head lice guidelines

Time from infestation to eggs hatching: Usually 5 to 7 days.

Symptoms: Itchy scalp, white specks stuck near the base of the hairs, lice may be found on the scalp.

Do I need to keep my child home?

No, as long as head lice management is ongoing.

How can I help prevent spread?

Family, friends and classroom contacts should be examined and managed if infested.

Head lice treatment Please ensure you check and treat each child if necessary. There are a multitude of products available (shampoos). Remember that a once off treatment isn't enough. Combing the nits (louse eggs) out of the hair with a very fine toothed comb is recommended daily for 14 days. A 2nd treatment shampoo is recommended 7 days after the first treatment. Please ensure you follow through as everyone co-operating is the only way we can break the head lice cycle.

We need every family to check to every head and treat as needed to avoid further outbreaks. Your cooperation would be appreciated.
