Terania District Athletics Carnival

Our Terania District Athletics Carnival will be held this **Friday 2nd August** at Riverview Park.

This is a whole school event. All children will participate in their age races.

Children will need to arrive at 8.45am to get their name tags and be ready for the March Past at 9am. We aim to finish at 2.15pm.

All children will participate in their age races based on the year that they were born. Two students will be nominated for discus and long jump in each age group. Students may also be involved in relays and ball games.

The age groups are: Juveniles (ages 5/6/7 years), Junior (ages 8/9/10 years), 11 Years, Senior (ages 12/13 years)

Covered foot wear is compulsory ALL DAY. Children should wear full school uniform and will be given school hats when they arrive.

A canteen selling food and drink will be available.

Winners will attend the Zone Athletics Carnival on Thursday 22rd August. Please note that there are qualifying heights and distances for the field events.

Transport to Riverview Park Transport is by private vehicle. Parents/carers who are able to attend the carnival can enjoy the day and your children certainly love to have you there. If you are unable to transport your child please make arrangements for them to travel with another school family.

Directions to Riverview Park Riverview Park is on Union St in South Lismore. Go through the Ballina St roundabout and cross the Hollingsworth Bridge. Just past the bridge is a short street on the left which is sign posted Riverview Park.

In case of wet weather The carnival will only be postponed if there is heavy rain or if the grounds have been closed by Lismore Council. If you are in any doubt you can listen for an announcement on ABC radio, 2LM and ZZZ after the 7am news bulletin if the carnival has been postponed.





Soundwaves Term 3

PLEASE ASK YOUR CHILD WHICH SOUND, CHANT&ACTION THEY ARE LEARNING THIS WEEK.



GAMES YOU COULD PLAY

RHYMING TIME: after writing a list word, think of words that **rhyme** with the list word, make a **SILLY SENTENCE**. Like: **bird-word-heard**, "I heard the bird sound out a word."

GRAPHEME SPLIT: Cut out SMALL SQUARE PIECES of paper. Before writing the word, let your child make a FIST AND LIFT ONE FINGER each time she/he sounds out one sound(phoneme) in the word. Each sound (phoneme) is written on one square. Place them in the correct order. When writing the next word with the same sound, the already created squares can be reused.

Like: G-oo-d-b-ye, LIFT UP 5 FINGERS — WRITE ON SQUARES: GOOD BYE

IMPORTANT - School Attendance Policy

Procedures for late arrival and early leaving

This is a reminder to all parents/carers about the Education Department's attendance policy. Please note the responsibilities for parents.

4. Responsibilities and delegations - 4.1 Parents:

- 4.1.1It is the duty of the parent of a child of compulsory school age to cause the child:
 - (a) to be enrolled at, and to attend, a government school or a registered non-government school, or
- (b) to be registered for home schooling with the Board of Studies, Teaching and Educational Standards (BOSTES) and to receive instruction in accordance with the conditions to which the registration is subject.
- 4.1.2 Parents are required to explain the absences of their children from school promptly and within seven days to the school. An explanation for absence must be provided to the school within 7 days of the first day of any period of absence.

Signing students in late and out early

Students who arrive late or leave early are recorded in the roll as having a partial absence on that day. It is always best to make appointments outside of school hours. The school auditor has requested a new procedure for

signing students in and out of school so that we can have an accurate record of partial absences.

Please sign your children IN and OUT at the office AND complete the late arrival / early leaving slip. (at the front counter)


Tony Park






Beekeeper visits the Library!


