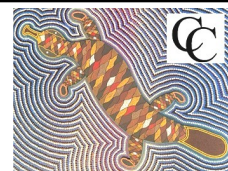

Swimming Carnival

This will be held on Friday 14 February at Lismore Memorial Baths. The school will be closed at Coffee Camp site. Those students who are 8 years and over are expected to be at the pool by 8.45am. Those under Year 1 students will be travelling with Miss Vos to participate in a Dorrroughby Day at Goolmangar PS. Please complete attached permission note and return to school.

All children in Years 3/4/5/6 are expected to attend the swimming carnival. Children born in 2011 who will be turning 8 in 2020 and who can swim at least 30 metres of a recognised stroke are encouraged to attend. **The events children enter are based on the year they were born and the age they are turning in 2020.**

What to pack Children will need swimmers, towel, sunscreen, hat, and a water bottle. Children may pack their own lunch OR take money for the pool canteen.

IMPORTANT There are no finals for any event. There may be 3 heats for an event. All winning places are based on times. Please discuss with your child that although they might win their heat they may not get a place if there are faster swimmers in the other heats. All students who don't get a place ribbon will get a participant ribbon.

Travel

Transport will be by private vehicle. *You will need to arrange your own transport to and from the Lismore Pool.* If you are unable to attend please arrange for your child to travel with another parent. Parents are welcome. We would love to see a crowd of parents supporting our swimmers.

Arriving at the pool

Please meet Mrs Wheeler at the pool at between 8.45-9.00am to have rolls marked. She will be just inside the turnstile where you will need to pay entry fees of \$3.00 per child and each spectator.

Leaving the pool

If you are leaving the pool early please make sure your child's name is marked off the roll by a Coffee Camp teacher.

Wet weather:

If it is only overcast or light rain the carnival will be on as there are no other dates available before the zone carnival. If there is any doubt about the carnival being on, there will be an announcement on ABC radio, 2LM and ZZZ at 7am.

Back up Carnival date: There is no back-up date available.

<p>RAINBOW WORDS (tracing one word several times with different colours) or Silly Sentences (write sentences containing three of four list words. d out a word.)</p> <p>GRAPHEME SPLIT: Cut out SMALL SQUARE PIECES of paper. Before writing the word, let your child make a FIST AND LIFT ONE FINGER each time she/he sounds out one sound (phoneme) in the word. Each sound (phoneme) is written on one square. Place them in the correct order. When writing the next word with the same sound, the already created squares can be reused. No Waste Lunch Day on Wednesdays

Tips for packing school lunch boxes

Pack food that is easy to open, easy to eat and not messy. Avoid using plastic wrap because children find it hard to pull apart and paper bags are better for the environment too. Write their name on their lunch box, water bottle and any other containers.

Use insulated lunch boxes or cooler bags.

Remind your child to wash their hands before eating at recess and lunch.

Road Safety Reminder

The best way to protect your children near traffic is to hold their hands. Young children do not make effective use of their hearing and vision, and lack the skills to make safe decisions when in the road traffic environment.

Bus Travel and Bus applications - online links

New applications are ONLY for students who have never previously had a bus pass. Otherwise do an UPDATE.

If you don't have ready access to the internet you can phone 131 500 for assistance with your application.

NEW applications <https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/applyNow> **are needed when:**

- Your child gets a bus pass for the first time. This may be when they start Kinder or it can be in any year if they have not previously travelled by bus.

UPDATES to existing applications <https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails> **are needed when:**

- You change your address
- Your child changes schools
- Your child moves into year 7

When your application is approved your bus company will provide you with a bus pass which should be carried at all times. It is a good idea to attach it securely to your child's school bag.

Our local bus contractor is Wallers. The bus departs Nimbin Central bus bay at 8.45am and has one pick up in Nimbin outside the Hospital at 8.48am. To arrange pick up locations and times outside Nimbin, phone your local bus which is Northern Rivers Buslines (6626 1499) for Jarlanbah/Falls Rd/Mountain Top and Quinns (0428 282137) for Gungas/Basil/Tuntable Falls/Stoney Chute/Crofton/Young Roads.

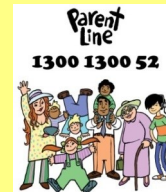
