## A note from the Relieving Principal

Dear Parents and Carers,

### P&C Meeting – Monday 27 June.

The next P&C meeting will be held on Monday the 27th of July, starting at 3:15pm in the school library. It would be wonderful to see as many people as possible attend. *(It is important to note that social distancing measures must be adhered to)*

### Covid-19 Update

Unfortunately, we have seen further outbreaks of Covid-19 spreading throughout the state. As a result, many of the planned activities for term 3 have been post-phoned or cancelled. This includes all school athletics/sporting carnivals and our senior class excursion to Canberra. I can assure all parents that as more information becomes available, everyone will be notified immediately. It is a regretful situation, however, for the health and safety of our students and staff, difficult decisions have had to be made. Please spend some time with your child/ren to help them understand Covid-19 and why many school events have had to be changed, post-phoned or cancelled.

*It is important that we are all aware of restrictions that remain in place and ensure we are doing our best to maintain appropriate health and safety measures.*

***Below are a few measures outlined by the NSW Department of Education:***

### Activities on hold until further notice

A small number of activities remain on hold and will be reconsidered during Term 3:

- Kindergarten orientation
- School camps
- Interstate excursions
- Parent and carer attendance at assemblies and other school events. (Further advice will be issued if restrictions are relaxed later in the term)
- Parent and carer volunteers – e.g. parent reading helpers (note: canteen and uniform shop volunteers are permitted)
- School-based activities that involve large gathering of adults. These include parent/community gatherings such as parent functions, working bees, fundraisers, school BBQs, large parent information evenings, and large on-site cultural events.
- Certain large arts and sports events are cancelled or delayed. Many large-scale arts events and sports tournaments rely upon feeder activities and have long-lead time organisational arrangements. As a consequence, a number of annual activities are planned to be delayed or cancelled.

### Safety and hygiene

- Physical distancing is not required for students
- Physical distancing of children in schools is not required by the latest AHPPC guidelines.

### **Guidance for community use and visitors to the school**

- Parents and carers who need to be on site for canteen or uniform shop purposes, or for other purposes where they are providing a service, must sign the visitor acknowledgement form.
- Non-essential adults are still not permitted on school grounds or at school events. This includes parents and carers except for face-to-face parent/teacher meetings that are essential (e.g. to discuss disciplinary or other welfare matters).
- Construction and maintenance providers may attend schools for asset-related activities.

### **Staff and students who have travelled through or visited Victoria**

As you would be aware the border between NSW and Victoria closed as of 12:01am 8 July 2020.

All staff and students returning from Victoria after this time must have a permit to enter NSW and are required to self-isolate for a period of 14 days.

With the exception of staff and students who reside in a border town, all other staff and students who have been in Victoria in the 14 days before the commencement of school should not attend school until they complete the 14 days self-isolation period since they left Victoria.

NSW Health has requested anyone who has been in Victoria and is unwell or has flu like symptoms arrange to be tested through their local medical practitioner or one of the COVID-19 clinics.

### **Symptoms of COVID-19**

- fever (37.5 ° or higher)
- cough
- sore/scratchy throat
- shortness of breath
- loss of smell or loss of taste.



### **Other reported symptoms of COVID-19 include**

- fatigue
- runny nose
- muscle pain
- joint pain
- diarrhoea
- nausea/vomiting or  
loss of appetite.

If your child presents with any of the above symptoms, please keep them at home until symptoms disappear and strongly consider a Covid-19 test, even if the symptoms are mild. For more information on testing, please go to:

### GAMES YOU COULD PLAY

**RHYMING TIME:** after writing a list word, think of words that **rhyme** with the list word, make a **SILLY SENTENCE**. Like:  
**bird-word-heard**, "I heard the bird sound out a word."

**GRAPHEME SPLIT:** Cut out **SMALL SQUARE PIECES of paper**. Before writing the word, let your child make a **FIST AND LIFT ONE FINGER** each time she/he sounds out one sound(phoneme) in the word. **Each sound (phoneme) is written on one square**. Place them in the correct order. When writing the next word with the same sound, the already created squares can be reused.

Like: G-oo-d-b-ye, LIFT UP 5 FINGERS – WRITE ON SQUARES: G OO D B YE

Dear parents, guardians and carers

**Re: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)**

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the *NCCD guidelines (2019)*.

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information.
